OB Navigation

Need:

- Harris County pre-term birth (PTB) rate in 2011 was 12.9%, ranging up to 19.8% in certain zip codes/areas
- Lack of dedicated navigation efforts for obstetric population at Harris Health
- Lack of dedicated resources to manage and coordinate prenatal care among high-risk patients


Intervention Site:

Harris Health System, Harris County

 Harris Health clinics strategically located in medically underserved areas that coincide with high rates of preterm births

Program Outcomes

Successes

- 1,209 patients enrolled in OB Navigation program (DY4 YTD 8/14/15)
- Streamlined process for patients discharged from the EC with a pregnancy diagnosis to ensure continuity or initiation of prenatal care
- High compliance rate with prenatal visits; decreased no-show rate

Challenges

- Patient risk factors such as low education level, low health literacy, financial needs, etc.
 remain a significant challenge in ensuring compliance with clinical recommendations
- During times when short staffed or emergencies arise, the OB Navigator is pulled to assist with staff nurse duties deferring navigator services

Next Steps

- Sharing program outcomes with other obstetric care providers
- Developing program sustainability plan to propose to executive leadership
